

Restroom Association wants ERP-type system for loos



THE Restroom Association of Singapore (RAS) has, in its three-year blueprint plan, recommended an ERP system for toilets.

Among its 35 recommendations: Charges for restroom visits, reported Channel NewsAsia.

Its aim: To bring 70 per cent of Singapore's 30,000 public toilets to RAS' three-star standard, meaning they must have basic amenities like hand soap and toilet paper and must be odour-free.

Said RAS President Tan Puay Hoon: "During peak hours, we'll charge the user. But... it comes to whether it is practical or not to set up the system... We will leave this to the restroom owners to decide which method is best for them."
